

Everyone is now satisfied that our processes and systems are effective and robust, and we look forward to handing out results to Year 13 on Tuesday 10 August and Year 11 on Thursday 12 August.

NEWSLETTER

Issue No: 10 – July 2021

We have, unfortunately, had to close the Year 9 bubble this half-term and instruct a number of other students to self-isolate. As a result, we were asked to 'surge' test in the last week of June which led to a few more cases in Years 9 and 10 and we are keeping everything crossed that we get to the summer holiday with no more cases. We have been asked to Track and Trace for 2 weeks into the summer break. This could mean that we will contact you if we receive notification of a positive case. In September we have been asked to mass test on return to school and testing will be used instead of isolation. Our new Year 9 students will return to school on Monday 6 September and all other years on Tuesday 7 September.

Years 10 and 12 underwent exam board assessments at the beginning of June. These went very well, on the whole, and were an invaluable experience for our Year 10 students who have not experienced exam conditions previously and our Year 12 who did not sit exams last year. This was about practising exam technique and helping us to identify students who are struggling. Some students found it very difficult sitting in exam conditions but must realise that, from September, failure to follow exam rules will lead to removal from an exam and the destruction of the paper. For most, this was a positive experience and good preparation for next year.

Year 9 have sat assessments and been able to access spaces such as the Science Labs. We know that this half-term has been incredibly disruptive for some of them but we hope that they have enjoyed accessing other parts of the building and being able to run Science experiments.

Thank you to all of you who have supported our high standards and expectations around the school. For the vast majority of students behaviour is outstanding and it makes me so proud to see them working so hard.

We have been able to go ahead with some of our extra-curricular work and it is exciting to run our Duke of Edinburgh expeditions in the last week of term. We have really had to pull back on our end of term activities this year in order to try to prevent further issues with Track and Trace.

I hope that you all have good summer break. Please remind students to take good care, especially around the roads and open water.

Amazon Fulfilment Centre Tour

Computer Science and IT students in Year 10 and Year 12 have been on a trip to an Amazon warehouse this term – well, virtually at least!

Students were able to see how Amazon operates from their online store to your doorstep, whilst discovering how computer science and state-of-the-art engineering help to deliver customer orders. The tour is focussed on the real world application of the concepts that they learn in the classroom; discovering how algorithms and machine learning power the fulfilment process.

During the tour students were able to interact live with the Amazon Tour Guides and meet the engineers behind the technology. This experience enabled students to consider practical uses of what they had learnt previously, as well as ask career related questions. We hope that in the future, one of our students will be writing algorithms or designing hardware to solve the fulfilment problems of tomorrow!

We were placed into groups and tasked with creating material for the group dance. To end the session Mayowa talked to us about the CAT programme, and 'a day in the life' of a professional dancer.

Moodometer



The course length will be set automatically according to the time of year you book and how many lessons we would expect to provide during the remainder of the school year, but all new courses are only committed to the 12 week "taster" period.
