### Maths

- Exam board: Pearson Edexcel
- 3 papers, 90 minutes long, 80 marks:
  - Paper 1: Non-Calculator, Thursday 14th May 2026
  - Paper 2: Calculator, Wednesday 3rd June 2026
  - Paper 3: Calculator, Wednesday 10th June 2026
- Students will be entered for Foundation (grades 1-5) or Higher (grades 3-9) tier
- You will need a pen, pencil, ruler, rubber, pair of compasses, protractor and a calculator for the exams





## **English Parental Support**

- Encourage your child to start revision early.
- Encourage your child to be organised and use a revision timetable and also space out the different topics they study.
- Ask your child if you can help them: chatting to them or using flashcards to quiz them etc.
- Lots of examination-style questions are available from your child's class teacher. Encourage them ask for extra questions, write responses under timed conditions and hand them in to their teacher for marking.
- Encourage your child to read the 'How to we revise for English Literature' sheet that gives hints on the best way to revise English.
- Ensure your child has breaks, eats well and gets a work/life balance.
